

Members professional background:




• Member 's profile by country of origin - Countries participating in our community: 98



Focus: UN-INSTRAW VIRTUAL DISCUSSION - May 2010 - Gender, Migration & Remittances

Our next virtual discussion will be on **Gender**, **Migration and Remittances** – in late May 2010 (dates will be advertised soon on our web page and by e-mail). The discussion will be based on the UN-INSTRAW and the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) research project: "**Migration**, **Remittances and Gender-Responsive Local Development**. **Case Studies: Albania**, **the Dominican Republic**, **Lesotho**, **the Philippines and Senegal**". The five case studies have analyzed the participation of women in the migration processes. The objective of the joint investigation is to connect the issues of development, gender equity and migration and make recommendations to key actors, including policy makers.

The executive summaries, as well as the full research reports and fact sheets are already available on UN-INSTRAW's web page (please, see the Media Kit). In the coming weeks, a friendly reminder of this virtual discussion will be sent to all community members along with a brief version of the six countries' findings, for an easy and quick reading.
