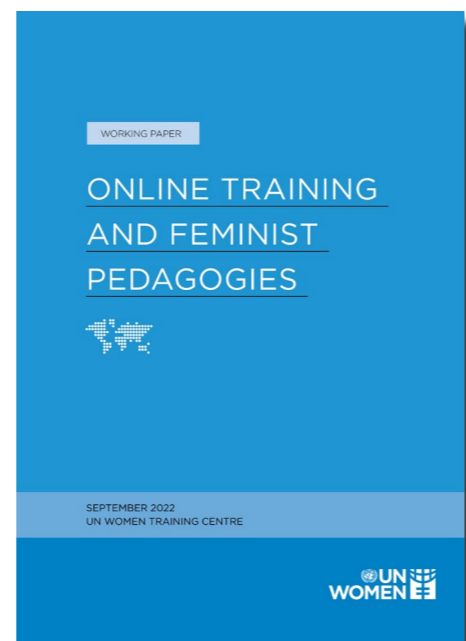
CONCEPT NOTE

Online training is here to stay. Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, online training has become the predominant modality for delivering training for gender equality worldwide.

But what implications does this shift to online learning have from the perspective of feminist pedagogical principles and practices? This question is at the heart of the UN Women Training Centre's new Working Paper on Online Training and Feminist Pedagogies.

Join us to celebrate the launch of our Working Paper with a **Virtual Dialogue Webinar** hosted by the UN Women Training Centre's Community of Practice (CoP) on **3 November 2022** at 10:00 New York time/16:00 Central European time.

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OBJECTIVES AND KEY QUESTIONS

- ✓ This Virtual Dialogue Webinar will present the key findings of the Working Paper on Online Training and Feminist Pedagogies, exploring the following key questions:
 - ✓ **To what** extent are feminist pedagogies applicable in an online setting? What challenges and opportunities does online training for gender equality present in terms of feminist pedagogical principles?
 - ✓ **What** issues need to be taken into account at different stages of the training cycle when we shift to online training?
 - ✓ **How** can online training be conducted in a way that is transformational, rather than merely technocratic or transactional? What experiences have gender trainers had in this regard?
