CONCEPT NOTE

The United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) and with the UN Women Training Centre have jointly designed I Know Gender Module 17 on Gender and Organized Crime.

The overall objective of this introductory course is to strengthen participants' knowledge, understanding and awareness of basic concepts related to gender equality and women's empowerment as these relate to the topic of organized crime. The aim is to promote the integration of a gender equality perspective in everyday work for those working in this field, such as UN staff, civil society and the private sector working to counteract organized crime, with a view to bringing about behaviour change and a transformational impact on women and girls.

The eLearning course is tailored to address thematic topics relevant the three pillars of UNODC's work programme – normative work, research and analytical work, and field-based technical cooperation projects to enhance the capacity of Member States to counteract illicit drugs, crime, corruption and terrorism. The target audience includes all UN personnel and stakeholders working in these areas.
